Dear Parents/Guardians,

Toorak Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Toorak's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, Toorak Primary School relies on these contributions, also known as the 'book list payment', made by families each year to enhance the learning tools, resources and facilities that provide the high-quality educational programs offered at the school.

Toorak Primary invites families to make the book list payment to ensure that all students have access to the same materials and resources in the classroom, as well as access to additional learning materials, student support services and IT technical support. Some schools provide a list to families of all the items that need to be purchased for the start of the school year and request they purchase those items individually. Our school has found that by purchasing the items on behalf of families, each student has the same materials and that teachers can tailor resources to their needs. This is more economical and provides funding for additional specialised materials to be included in the curriculum.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

- Before a refund request can be processed, either the original receipt is to be produced or the receipt number is to be identified, and the refund must be approved by the Business Manager.
- A reimbursement form with parent's bank details must be filled out and any relevant documentation attached.
- The family may authorise a credit to be placed on to the family account statement.

Please find the fee schedule for 2024 attached. Toorak Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

Student wellbeing Contribution – TPS has a dedicated Student Wellbeing Officer 3 days a week. Their role is to support individual student wellbeing and coordinate various programs across the school. Our wellbeing program includes the engagement of professionals such as a Speech Therapist and Occupational Therapist. Your contribution supports us in developing our knowledge of the many different student needs and the best approach to assist them and their families. TPS is committed to supporting all our students and families in reconnecting with each other as we continue to move forward from the last 2 years of lockdowns and hardship.
